A LONG TRADITION OF YOUTH & FAIRS

For 90 years the Ontario 4-H program and Agricultural Societies have shared a strong relationship. Since the first Club started in Waterloo County, in 1915, the Achievement Day at the local fair is often the highlight of the 4-H year for many 4-H members.

In 2005, to commemorate its anniversary, 4-H Ontario recognized the important role that Ontario's Agricultural Societies have played in the success of the 4-H program.

Over the last nine decades the 4-H program has changed. Initially it was an avenue to promote new agricultural and homemaking information and skills to rural Ontario. In the 60s the focus of the 4-H program changed to place more emphasis on the personal development of youth, but has expanded into the urban areas and offers a variety of topics.

In 2004, over 6,500 young people participated in over 900 clubs. Through the dedication of more than 1,500 volunteers, members participate in a variety of projects, ranging from livestock to life skills to drama and social recreation.

WHAT IS 4-H?

4-H is an informal educational program which helps young people, ages 9-21, develop a variety of skills related to projects of special interest to the members. The four H's stand for HEAD, HEART, HANDS AND HEALTH representing the mental, emotional, social and physical development of young people.

The 4-H show is sponsored by the Smithville Agricultural Society in co-operation with Agriculture Canada, and the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food.

PURPOSE:

1. To supplement and encourage Junior Activities as organized by the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food in the area served by the Fair.
2. To provide an opportunity for rural youth to compare their projects with other members and to develop their showmanship and presentation skills.
3. To improve the educational value of the Fair.
4. To develop new exhibitors for the future.
5. To stimulate the interest of a greater number of people in the Fair.

SECTION A - 4-H LIVESTOCK CLUBS ACHIEVEMENT DAYS

OBJECTIVES OF 4-H DAIRY & BEEF

1. To create a greater interest among young people in caring for, feeding, developing and marketing milk and meat products.
2. To develop a better general knowledge of the evaluation and selection of livestock.
3. To encourage the adoption of better feeding and management methods in the Club district.
4. To encourage the improvement of type and quality of livestock in the Club district.

THE 4-H LIVESTOCK PROJECT

Each member feeds, and cares for a dairy or beef calf from May to September. They learn the recommended practices of feeding, management and marketing, and keep a record of the cost of production.

1. Exhibitor must be a member of the Smithville Agricultural Society.
2. All goats must be registered with the Canadian Goat Society. Original registration certificates only are acceptable for all animals and must be presented to the show secretary before the show.
3. Base date for calculating the age of the animals to be computed from the date of birth to the first day of the month which the fair opens.
4. There will be no pre-show milk-out, however, the judge may call for a milk-out any time in any class.
5. All goats must be on the grounds by 11:00 a.m. and **remain on display until 5:00 p.m. or prize money will be forfeited.**
6. There will be an animal inspection conducted by a group of 3 members of the C.G.S. in good standing. All animals must pass this inspection.
7. The maximum total eligible exhibits from a breeding unit is 10 head. An exhibitor may enter 3 animals in any two classes, to a total of 10 animals per breed.
8. In each section there must be a minimum of three animals to qualify for full prizes.
9. No bedding will be supplied.

Exhibitors are requested to be neatly and appropriately attired (preferably in white) when showing their animals in the ring.

Prize Money: 1st: \$25.00, 2nd: \$20.00, 3rd: \$15.00, 4th: \$10.00, 5th: \$8.00, 6th: \$5.00. Above prize money for classes A, B, C, D.
