General rules and regulations will be those of the Smithville Fair as stated in the Fair Prize List.

1. All animals exhibited must be registered and recorded on the records of the Holstein Association of Canada in the name of the exhibitor.
2. Substitutions of entries will be allowed prior to the judging.
3. Health Requirements: Ontario is a Brucellosis free region. All animals should be free of mange, pinkeye, ringworm, etc.
4. Exhibitors are subject to the Code of Ethics for Dairy Cattle Exhibitors.

## CLASSES

- Class A Novice Showmanship** (calf can be any age). Must be exhibited by a showperson who is pre-4-H age. Group placing. \$5.00 to each exhibitor.
- Class 1 Junior Calf** (Born after Feb. 28, 2011)  
**Class 2 Intermediate Calf** (Dec. 1/10 to Feb. 28/11)  
**Class 3 Senior Calf** (September 1/10 to November 30/10)  
**Class 4 Summer Yearling** (Born June 1/10 to August 31/10)  
**Class 5 Junior Yearling** (Born Mar. 1/10 to May 31/10)  
**Class 6 Winter Yearling** (Born Dec. 1/09 to Feb. 28/10)  
**Class 7 Senior Yearling** (Born Sept. 1/09 to Nov 30 /09)  
**Class 8 Junior Herd.** A group of three animals limited to one exhibit per exhibitor. The exhibitor must have bred all three animals and own at least two.  
**Junior and Reserve Champion Female** (ribbons only)

## PRIZE MONEY

Prize money in Classes 1 to 8 shall be:

1st - \$25      2nd - \$20      3rd - \$15      4th - \$10  
5th - \$8      All other entrants - \$6.00

Entry fee shall be 15% of prize money.

## ENTRY PROCEDURE

Exhibitors are required to enter animals on entry sheets enclosed. These sheets must be returned to Fair Secretary, Wendy McKillop, P.O. Box 796, Smithville, ON L0R 2A0, by August 25, 2011.

2. **Bull** - born between 1/10 and December 31/10
3. **Jr. Champion Male** - RIBBONS ONLY
4. **Bull** - born between January 1/09 and December 31/09
5. **Sr. Champion Male** - RIBBONS ONLY
6. **Grand Champion Male** - Ribbon and SPECIAL: 1 Block of Red Salt DONATED BY MINOR BROTHERS, NIAGARA ON THE LAKE, ON
7. **Female** - Calf (born on or after January 1/11) Minimum of 3 months of age when judged.

8. **Female** - born between April 1/10 and December 31/10
9. **Female** - born between January 1/10 and March 31/10
10. **Jr. Champion & Reserve Female** - Ribbon and SPECIAL: A package of grooming products donated by RK ANIMAL SUPPLIES, MOOREFIELD, ON; and **Junior Reserve Champion Female** - RIBBON ONLY
11. **Female** - born between January 1/09 and December 31/09 with her own 2011 natural, purebred, tattooed calf at foot.
12. **Female** - born prior to January 1/09 with her own 2011 natural, purebred, tattooed calf at foot
13. **Sr. Champion Female** - RIBBONS ONLY
14. **Grand Champion Female** - Ribbon and Special: 1 block of Red Salt DONATED BY MINOR BROTHERS, NIAGARA ON THE LAKE, ON
15. **Get of Sire** - A group of three animals from the same sire, both sexes represented. At least one animal owned by the exhibitor. Animals must be shown in previous classes.
16. **Breeder's Herd** - A group of four animals from the same sire, both sexes represented, must be exhibited in one of the above classes. At least one animal must be owned by the exhibitor. Please have your individual pedigrees available.
17. **Progeny of Dam** - a group of two animals, either sex, the progeny of one dam, must be shown in previous classes. One animal must be owned by the exhibitor.

## 4-H Clubs

### A LONG TRADITION OF YOUTH & FAIRS

For 90 years the Ontario 4-H program and Agricultural Societies have shared a strong relationship. Since the first Club started in Waterloo County, in 1915, the Achievement Day at the local fair is often the highlight of the 4-H year for many 4-H members.

In 2005, to commemorate its anniversary, 4-H Ontario recognized the important role that Ontario's Agricultural Societies have played in the success of the 4-H program.

Over the last nine decades the 4-H program has changed. Initially it was an avenue to promote new agricultural and homemaking information and skills to rural Ontario. In the 60s the focus of the 4-H program changed to place more emphasis on the personal development of youth, but has expanded into the urban areas and offers a variety of topics.

In 2004, over 6,500 young people participated in over 900 clubs. Through the dedication of more than 1,500 volunteers, members participate in a variety of projects, ranging from livestock to life skills to drama and social recreation.
