SECTIONS

1. Yearling Ewe - 3rd pair of temporary incisors must be in place.
2. Ewe lamb - 1st pair of temporary incisors must be in place, born property of the exhibitor.
3. Yearling Ram - 3rd pair of temporary incisors must be in place.
4. Ram lamb - 1st pair of temporary incisors must be in place, born property of exhibitor.
5. Get of Sire - Born property of exhibitor, a group of three animals by the same sire, 1st pair of temporary incisors must be in place, both sexes may be represented.
6. Breeder's Flock - bred and owned by exhibitor, a group of four animals, both sexes to be represented. All in group must have been exhibited in one of the preceding classes. Must be of same breed.

Cattle

1. Definition of an Entry: All registered cattle whether owned by one person or by more than one person (individually or jointly) which are maintained on one farm or breeding unit, are considered to be the production of one farm or breeding unit. In each classification where the same or common interests are involved in more than one breeding operation such operations are considered as ONE breeding unit.
2. All entries must be owned by and registered in the name of the exhibitor.
3. All exhibitors must become members of the Smithville Agricultural Society for a fee of \$7.00.
4. Entries must be forwarded to the Fair Secretary: Smithville Agricultural Society, c/o Wendy McKillop, P.O. Box 796, Smithville, Ontario L0R 2A0
5. If there are less than twelve animals and three exhibitors, only one half of the prize money will be paid.
6. In each section there must be a minimum of 3 animals to qualify for full prizes.
7. A breeding unit may enter only one animal per section, except an exhibitor may have a maximum of two entries in junior classes and up to three entries in any mature class provided total entries is ten head.
8. No bedding will be supplied.

Entry Fee - 15% of prize money

Cattle Judging to start at 1:00 p.m. SHARP except Holstein Show which starts at noon. No livestock parade.

All cattle to remain on display until at least 5:00 p.m. or prize money will be forfeited.

Rules and Regulations for Showing Holstein Cattle

The following supports good animal husbandry practices at shows, while presenting a positive image to spectators. All exhibitors and their fitters, agents, or other representatives agree to abide by the following rules and regulations.

PART I

The following practices or procedures are unacceptable in the show ring of registered holstein cattle:

1. misrepresenting the age, calving date, number of lactations, or ownership of an animal;
2. filling an animal's rumen unnaturally with liquid [tubing];
3. balancing the udder by any means other than by leaving naturally produced milk in any or all quarters;
4. treating the udder internally with an irritant, counter-irritant, or any other substance to temporarily improve conformation or produce unnatural animation;
5. treating the udder externally with an irritant, counter-irritant, or any other substance to temporarily improve conformation or produce unnatural animation (Allowable practices/substances include sealing and setting teats, and the use of external anti-inflammatory substances for the well-being of the animal.);
6. roping udders and the use of objects to physically improve definition of the suspensory center ligament;
7. administering epidural anaesthesia [blocking tails] and/or applying any irritant either externally or internally to the perineal [rectum and vagina] area;
8. inserting foreign material/articles under the skin, into the topline [including hair not attached to its own hair follicle];
9. applying foreign material/articles on the feet;
10. performing surgery of any kind to change the natural contour of appearance of the animal's body, hide or hair. Not included is the removal of warts, teats and horns, clipping and dressing of hair and trimming of hooves;
11. criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring; as well as any conduct that violates, directly or indirectly, recognized standard show practices, or any other discreditable conduct that could damage the image of the breed or show;
12. wrapping hocks or draining fluid from hocks unless authorized by a veterinarian appointed by the show management.

PART II

All exhibitors and their fitters, agents or other representatives agree to abide by the following procedures:

1. Exhibitors, agents, employees or other person acting on behalf of an exhibitor, shall deliver to an inspector upon request any hypodermic syringe, needle or other device, swabs, cloths or other material, or samples or any medicine, preparation or substance, whether in liquid or other form, for the purposes of laboratory analysis.
2. All entries and personal property of the exhibitors, their servants and agents and persons acting on behalf of exhibitors, are subject to inspection by inspectors authorized by a show. All such persons shall cooperate with the inspectors and shall provide all such information in connection with such inspections and shall provide access to the
