RULES:

1. Only one entry from each child will be accepted in each section.
2. All entries must have been made by the child who is entering them. If there is any doubt or question of this, child's parent will be asked to confirm before prize money will be paid.
3. It is not necessary to be a member of the Smithville Agricultural Society, but each entrant requires an exhibitor number. In order to avoid delay in entry time, please request your entry forms and exhibitor number from the Secretary at 905-957-6207 by August 25th.
4. All exhibits must be in the hall between the hours of 6:30 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. Tuesday or noon and 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday before the fair, and must remain until 6:00 p.m. Sunday. Exhibits to be picked up between 6:00 and 8:00 p.m. on Sunday.
5. No entry fee will be charged but 10% will be deducted instead from all prize money over \$10.00.
6. **Please mark clearly on tag the age of the child.**
7. Elementary Fair open to children up to and including age 11.
8. Elementary age exhibitors who wish to enter junior categories may do so if they purchase a \$4.00 Junior Membership.

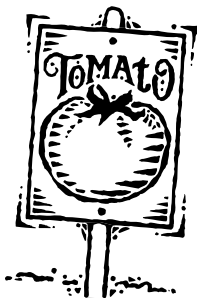


BEST LUNCHBOX SNACK CONTEST

7. Green Peppers, 2
8. Decorated vegetable to look like a cartoon character
9. Longest Zucchini
10. Cucumber, any variety, 2 of the same variety
11. Vegetable centrepiece, in wicker basket for dining room table



The above vegetables to be from the home or farm garden.

Choose medium-sized carrots. Choose regular-shaped specimens. Choose specimens as nearly the same shape and size as possible. Cut off tops leaving only one inch. Choose specimens which are free from blemish of any kind. Polish with a dry cloth. Entries must be submitted on a **paper plate** with entry tag attached.

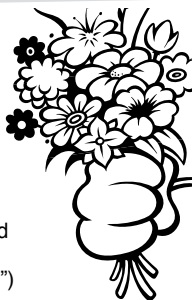
